

The first interview with Noor Suwwan was filmed on June 2, 2025 in Novotel Al Barsha in Dubai (United Arab Emirates) in occasion of the Young Economic Forum Dubai 2025. On June 28, I met Leila El Houssi, and on July 8, I interviewed Rosanna Maryam Sirignano. Finally, on July 10, I went to Milan in the Palace of the Lombardia Region to film Pierfrancesco Majorino.



CHALLENGES!

I need to admit that the greatest challenge I have faced while running the project (still in progress) is time! First of all, Italian university professors in June and July are usually busy with the summer exam session, and August is often a holiday season, meaning that their availability was significantly limited. Additionally, due to personal issues related to my upcoming departure to the United States, I could not be in my home country for the planned period. This is why half of the agreed interviews had to be postponed to the winter break (Tokoua Ben Mohamed, Sara Borrillo, Deborah Scolart, and Paolo Branca). Hence, the documentary will be completed by summer 2026.



After completion, the documentary will be screened in private Italian cinemas, where the majority of the financial GoMakeADifference award will be spent. On these occasions, it is likely that fundraising initiatives will be organized in support of "Doctors Without Borders." Subsequently, the documentary will be sent to the "Festival dei Popoli."

HOW DO I MAKE A DIFFERENCE?

Reading this PDF, it is clear that my project underwent numerous changes compared to what was planned when applying for the "GoMakeADifference" Award. While still at UWC Robert Bosch, I held meetings with other students who were interested in taking part in the project, but coordinating the group became overly complicated and the funds would have been immediately used up. Moreover, the possibilities for others to record were extremely limited, and after trying to find compromises, I decided to work on the project independently. This is also why the number of units planned for expenses was reduced, and I will now have the possibility to organize more events for the screening of the documentary!!!

While recording the interviews, all the experts thanked me for taking the responsibility to initiate the project, given the urgency of religious anti-discrimination activities in Italy. I have to admit that currently I don't have the possibility to clearly trace what the impact of the project has been, given that it is not completed, but I can still describe the impact it had on me, and in following reports I will better outline its impact on my community!
